



With their payload of acidity and opulent fruit flavors, Washington reds seem built for barbeque. Pricewise it's hard to beat the offerings from Saviah, a Walla Walla winery the Funk family launched in 2000. The Jack, their entry-level tier pulled from vineyards around the Columbia Valley, includes a clean-lined riesling with crisp apple and lime flavors to prime the palate while dinner is cooking. When the meat's off the grill, there's a juicy merlot-based red blend and a raspberry-bright, herbal 2010 Syrah that's hard to resist for its straightforward appeal. —P.J.C.
